Instructions

Part One: What Happened at Pearl Harbor

In this portion of the study, they will watch two YouTube videos that explain what happened at Pearl Harbor. After they have finished the videos, the student will complete the fill in the blank worksheet that is included. After they have completed the worksheet, they should check their answers with the answer key.

The purpose of Part One is to lay a good foundation of knowledge about the events of December 7, 1941.

Part Two: Pearl Harbor Timeline Project

This portion of the study starts with a short YouTube video. Then they will put together a timeline of events for that day.

If you choose to use the Pearl Harbor Printable packet, the students will cut out the Pearl Harbor Timeline Cards and glue them in order on the Pearl Harbor Timeline provided.

The purpose of Part Two is to help the student recognize when everything happened that day. This is an opportunity for them to map out the sequence of events.

Part Three: Pearl Harbor Timeline Game

This part of the lesson plan offers the child the chance to learn how to figure differences in times. They will get the chance to calculate the difference in times between events.

If you choose the Pearl Harbor Printable Packet, the students are given games cards with questions written on them and they are to match up with the correct answer.

After they have mastered it, they get to play a relay race to see how fast they can do the activity. They will time themselves with a stopwatch and try to beat their own time.

Part Four: Writing Assignment

In their own words, write a short essay about the bombing of Pearl Harbor.

Part One: What Happened at Pearl Harbor?

Hello! In this unit study, we are going to be talking about the bombing of Pearl Harbor during World War 2.

On a quiet Sunday morning in December 1941, the Japanese surprised the United States with an attack on the US Naval base in Pearl Harbor. Over 2,400 people lost their lives in this attack.

Pearl Harbor is located on the island of Oahu in Hawaii.

At this time, World War 2 had been happening for two years and the US had not entered the war. However, this all changed when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor.

The next day, December 8, 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt declared war on Japan and now the US was a part of World War 2.

Supplies: Pearl Harbor Timeline Game Cards from Pearl Harbor Printable Packet, Scissors, Stopwatch, Completed Timeline, and outdoor space.

1. Cut apart the Pearl Harbor Timeline Game Cards.
2. Match the questions to the correct answers.
3. Use the timeline you made for a reference.

Timeline Relay Race

1. Take the game outside*.
2. Place the question cards at one end of the yard and the answer cards at the other end of the yard.
3. Start the stopwatch and see how quickly you can match them up correctly.
4. Check your answers. For every incorrect answer add a 3-second penalty to your time.
5. Do it again and see if you can beat your previous time.

**If outside is not an option, place the cards at one end of a room and the other set of cards at the other end of a room.*

Do-It-Yourself

Activity: Pearl Harbor Timeline Game

Supplies: Paper and Completed Timeline

1. Create some questions about your timeline. For example, how long did the bombing of Pearl Harbor last?
2. Give a sibling or a friend a copy of your timeline and see if they can answer your questions correctly.

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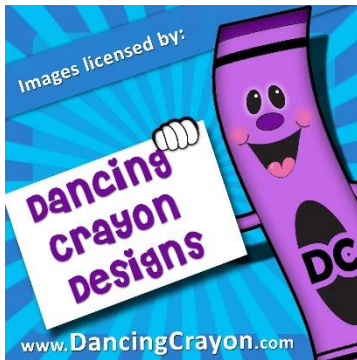
